# CASS/PULASKI COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS

## MISSION:

Cass/Pulaski Community Corrections is committed to improving the quality of life of the program participants and the community by applying effective evidence based programs that produce positive choices, constructive behavior and accountability from the program participants, thereby reducing their criminal actions

**VISION:** To beat all aspects of recidivism.

# **WORK RELEASE REOPENING RENOVATIONS:**

In May, we began returning the Work Release Program to normal operations after installation of the Intercept Body Scanner. Clients are able to maintain employment, but are not awarded community passes, unless they have received their COVID-19 Vaccine to limit exposure to other residents and staff. We continue to remain limited to 25 male residents only and abide by social distancing guidelines. Work Crew residents continue to participate in the therapeutic model and all residents participate in programming, including MRT and New Directions. We are excited to announce that the Commissioners have committed to renovating our facility to allow for expansion and the addition of two isolation cells, to support the reopening of the Women's Dorm. The Adult Probation Department will move into the Health Department's current office, once they have finished transitioning to their new Smith Street Location, providing CPCC with space to expand and renovate the current infrastructure to support fullreopening.


## **MAY OVERVIEW:**

In May, Community Corrections served 155 clients, 14 clients in the Work Release program and 141 via the Home Detention/ Electronic Monitoring program. We had an average daily population of 125 clients. The department received 20 new clients in April:

- 7 Level 6 Felonies or Class D Felonies
- 7 High Level Felonies
- 4 Misdemeanors
- 2 Juvenile Supervisions

13 clients completed the program, while 5 clients were returned to either the Cass County or Pulaski County Jail on a violation.




# • Population Analysis:

- 14 Work Release Clients
- 141 Home Detention Clients
- 14 Clients participated in Work Crew
- 12 CTP Clients
- 30 Courtesy Transfers
- 92 clients were serving a term originating from Cass County, while 24 were serving a sentence from Pulaski County.
- 11 are participating in Juvenile Community Corrections or GPS Monitoring.


# • Offense Type Analysis:

• Analysis shows that 32% are drug and alcohol related offenses, 19% crimes against property, 17% crimes against persons, 3% weapon related offenses, 8% public health and admin. offenses, 16% traffic offenses and 5% fall into the other category.



## • Drug Screens:

Out of 137 drugs screens administered this past month,
8.5% were positive.




#### **WORK CREW & BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT UPDATES:**

 Work crew clients have placed over 180 barrels and 177 baskets throughout Logansport and Cass County as part of our annual beautification project and completed over 300 hours of community service including maintaining and mowing county properties and tree trimming.

# • Risk Analysis:

 Analysis shows that 25% of active clients have been identified through the Indiana Risk Assessment as High Risk to Very High Risk, 47% as Moderate Risk, and 27% as Low Risk.



• A review of the IRAS-CST's conducted show an average risk reduction of -.07% in April.

#### **NOTABLE UPDATES:**

- We have finished preparing our CY2022 IDOC Grant Applications. Upon Commissioner and Board Approval we will submit them to IDOC and receive notice of awarded funding in early September.
- In Collaboration with all members of the local criminal justice system we are beginning to assemble our Local JRAC Council in preparation for the July 1, 2021 legislation.
